Good Shepard Sunday



The figure of God as a shepherd who guides and protects the flock was taken from Israel's pastoral life. Sheep that belonged to various shepherds were brought together in a sheepfold at night. At daybreak, the watchman would open the gate. The shepherd knew his own sheep and he would call each one by name as he led them out of the sheepfold. The sheep recognized the shepherd's voice and would follow no one else. The shepherd would walk ahead of his flock as they followed him to a place where they would be safe from thieves who might come to "steal and slaughter and destroy" (v.10). Jesus is the "gate for the sheep" (v.7). Those who enter through him will be saved.

VOCATION SUNDAY



The Fourth Sunday of Easter is referred to as Good Shepherd Sunday. In John 21:15-18, Jesus makes Peter the chief shepherd of the flock. This day was designated in 1964 as the World Day of Prayer for Vocations. In his Easter message Pope Francis I declared: "The Risen Shepherd goes in search of all those lost in the labyrinths of loneliness and marginalization. He comes to meet them through our brothers and sisters who treat them with respect and kindness, and help them to hear his voice, an unforgettable voice, a voice calling them back to friendship with God." The Church's sanctity depends essentially on her union with Christ and her openness to the mystery of grace at work in the hearts of believers.

The purpose of the **World Day of Prayer for Vocations** is to publically fulfill the Lord's instruction to, "Pray the Lord of the harvest to send laborers into his harvest" (Mt 9:38; Lk 10:2). As a climax to a prayer that is continually offered throughout the Church, it affirms the primacy of faith and grace in all that concerns vocations to the priesthood and to the consecrated life. While appreciating all vocations, the Church concentrates its attention this day on vocations to the *ordained ministries* (priesthood and diaconate), to the *Religious life* in all its forms (male and female, contemplative and apostolic), to *societies of apostolic life*, to *secular institutes* in their diversity of services and membership, and to the missionary life, in the particular sense of *mission "ad genets"*.

Crowning Mary, Queen of us all

May brings us to a special month to honor the Blessed Virgin Mary. We have our First Communicants participate in a May Crowning in recognition of her role as Queen of All Saints. Such events are often special memories for Catholics.

In the Catholic faith there are different devotions to the Blessed Virgin Mary. Special devotions to Mary in May date back to the time of St. Philip Neri who died in 1595. He began a custom of decorating the statue of the Blessed Mother with spring flowers in early May. Annibale Dionisi, an Italian Jesuit proposed devotions to Mary throughout the entire month of May.

The month of May began to be celebrated in honor of Mary in the sixteenth century with similar types of festivities including floral tributes, processions and crowning of the statue. Soon it spread all over the world. In the United States May procession and May crowning became current prior to the Second Vatican Council. The practice continues in parishes and schools where a statue of Mary is honored with a wreath of fresh blossoms to indicate the virtues of Mary. Mary is celebrated as a queen because she was the perfect follower of Jesus Christ and the absolute 'crown' of creation.

As a child I remember participating in many May Crowning's, it was always a special time for me. Try to spend some special time with Mary this May.
